II. Community Updates

- a. Walking Trail (Cross Creek, Spring Forest Loop)
 - i. Spring Forest Rd- would create a connected loop from Cross Creek to Spring Forest. Pedestrian right of away will need to be obtained from the last few lots of the loop by Samuel Blackman.
 - ii. Bike lockers were suggested for the trail. There is evidence that public bike lockers increase wellness in the community. Near 80% of funding would come from CATbus.
 - iii. When the trail is finalized, it is important to show the usage of such trail because it can lead to other ventures.
- b. Green Crescent Trail
 - i. Working toward this, and the CCSF Loop is the first step.
- c. Open/Vacant Properties
 - i. More restaurant options are needed.
 - ii. Helping Hands (the former building) was purchased and a smoothie bar/aerobics center will be launched in that space. These new owners have interest in cleaning up the back alley lot behind downtown Central.
 - iii. Council has agreed to pursue working with the county to take the laundry mat down and clean up that space.
- d. Potential Business Ideas/Pop-Up Businesses
 - i. More food establishments.
 - ii. Central needs to have billboards advertising for our businesses or town.
 - iii. Possible park and ride from Central on CU game days. Vendors could set up, etc. and customers could stay and tailgate.
